For writers of every level, from beginners to bestsellers, Silk Road Slippers Writing Masterclasses offer a literary experience unlike any other. Participants have unparalleled access to some of the most celebrated figures in the literary world.

The setting is an inspiring location: amid the book-lined interiors, Moorish arches and palm-fringed pools of Jnane Tamsna, an exquisite fifteen acre private estate in the natural wonder of Marrakech's Palmeraie. Over the course of five days, you will participate in twice-daily sessions with a small group, led by legendary publisher Alexandra Pringle and her team of industry insiders.

Silk Road Slippers Masterclasses are designed to transform your writing practice, both by unlocking your creative potential and by developing the technical skills to develop your unique voice. We do this through a combination of hands-on exercises, immersive workshops, and participatory seminars.

You will receive rare access to insider knowledge of the publishing process from Alexandra Pringle, the former Editor-in-Chief of one of the world's most distinguished publishing houses, alongside her exceptional team: author and columnist Nesrine Malik, author and screenwriter Alex von Tunzelmann, and editor and literary consultant Faiza S. Khan.

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Midnight at the Oasis

In an oasis of calm just half an hour's drive from the bustling souks of Marrakech, learn the principles of storytelling and life writing in a booklined library, focus on drafting and editing by one of the five pools, stroll the spectacular gardens designed by ethnobotanist Gary Martin, or enjoy a refreshing cup of Moroccan mint tea in the elegant contemporary North African interiors curated by hotelier Meryanne Loum-Martin.

Each day includes a scheduled morning and afternoon session with the Silk Road Slippers team, with a light lunch in between. Kamila Shamsie joins us for two days and leads two exclusive sessions, sharing her expertise, technique and experiences, as well as joining us socially for our Celebratory Dinner. This is a unique opportunity for you to learn from the absolute best in the business, up close and personal.

There is free time in the afternoons for writing practice. Or, if you prefer, you may use that time to relax and find inspiration. Jnane Tamsna offers private yoga sessions in the garden or on the roof, tennis, swimming, cycling, and spa treatments. The delights of Marrakech are a short drive away.

Our evenings include candlelit dinners prepared by the acclaimed Jnane Tamsna team – often using organic ingredients grown on the estate itself. At these dinners, you will have the opportunity to mingle and make creative connections with your fellow writers, and spend time with the Silk Road Slippers team and in the company of the Star Writer. Two evenings are kept free for you to explore Marrakech at night, or relax at your accommodation, as you choose.

At the end of the course, every participant will be offered a one-on-one feedback session with a member of the Silk Road Slippers team. This is your opportunity to receive feedback tailored specifically to the next steps of your writing journey from an industry professional.


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
Kamila Shamsie is the internationally renowned author of eight novels. Her novel *Home Fire* won the Women's Prize for Fiction in 2018. It was also longlisted for the Man Booker Prize 2017, shortlisted for the Costa Best Novel Award, and won the London Hellenic Prize.

Burnt Shadows was shortlisted for the Orange Prize and A God in Every Stone was shortlisted for the Women's Bailey's Prize and the Walter Scott Prize. Her work has been translated into the thirty languages.

A vice president and fellow of the Royal Society of Literature, she was one of Granta's Best of Young British Novelists in 2013.

Kamila Shamsie was born and grew up in Karachi, Pakistan. Her most recent novel, *Best of Friends*, was published in 2022. She is professor of creative writing at the University of Manchester.







Schedule

Please note that this schedule is indicative and may be subject to change.

Sunday

Participants arrive in Marrakech and settle into their accommodation.

8pm: Welcome Dinner at Jnane Tamsna

10am-12.30pm: **CONNECTING CHARACTERS with Kamila Shamsie**Kamila describes her creative process and discusses her 25-year

editorial relationship with Alexandra. Then, Kamila leads a workshop on how to create a character through building significant relationships.

12.30pm: Lunch.

1.30pm-3.45pm: **DRAFTING AND REDRAFTING** with Silk Road Slippers Whether it's your first book or tenth, conquer your fear of the blank page and build your editorial toolkit.

3.45pm-6pm: **Creative practice**Use this time for writing practice or relaxation.

8pm: **Celebratory Dinner with Kamila Shamsie**A reading by Kamila will be followed by a candlelit dinner at Jnane Tamsna with the whole team.

Wednesday

10am-12.30pm: **A CRUCIAL ELEMENT with Kamila Shamsie** and the Silk Road Slippers Team

Kamila will discuss an element she considers essential to her work. This may include Character, Dialogue, Sense of Place, Language, or any other aspect of writing, to be determined by Kamila.

12.30pm: **Transport to the 11th century Medina for lunch** On the rooftop of the Monde des Arts de la Parure.


3pm: Free time in the Medina or transport back to Jnane Tamsna

10am-1.30pm: PERSONAL FEEDBACK SESSIONS



Frequently Asked Questions

What level are the Masterclasses? Do I need to be a published writer?

The only requirement to join Silk Road Slippers Masterclasses is passion! Our Masterclasses are suitable for everyone, from aspiring writers who have yet to pick up a pen, to working writers who want to expand their skills into narrative and creative writing. Our goal is to create an informal and supportive atmosphere in which everyone can benefit from the best possible tuition and experience, whatever their own level of expertise.

Are the classes taught in English? Do I have to write in English?

The classes are all taught in English. You may write in any language you choose, but please be aware that we will only be able to read or give feedback on writing in English.

Can I bring a friend or partner?

Of course! Friends or partners who are not participating in the Masterclasses may join the three dinners for a fee – please contact us. Lunches are reserved for participants only.

What sort of food can I expect?

Jnane Tamsna serves seasonal Mediterranean, light Moroccan and Oriental food. All ingredients at Jnane Tamsna are locally sourced and organic. All vegetables and herbs are home grown.

Do you cater for vegetarians and other dietary needs?

We certainly cater for vegetarians and can adapt for most dietary needs. Please let us know any requirements when you book.

Can I record or film the sessions?

We respectfully ask that you not record or film our sessions except with permission, to protect the privacy of our Star Writers and your fellow participants.

What equipment should I pack?

You may bring a laptop if you would like to use it in your own writing practice, but it is not necessary. We provide notebooks and pens for the sessions.

What clothes should I pack?

The weather in Marrakech in November is mostly dry, mild and pleasant, with a day high of 23°C/73°F and evening low of 11°C/51°F. We encourage everyone to relax and feel comfortable at the Masterclasses, so please dress as you wish. The three evening dinners and especially the Celebratory Dinner are an opportunity to dress up if you enjoy doing so – but there is no dress code. If you would like to swim, take a yoga session or participate in any activities, please pack what you need!

What if I need to cancel?

We strongly advise all participants to take out a comprehensive travel insurance policy to cover any eventuality that might prevent them from travelling. To secure your booking, we need a deposit of £1000. This is non-refundable. The balance is payable by 1 September 2024. If the balance is not paid by that date, Silk Road Slippers reserves the right to cancel your booking and retain the deposit. Once the full balance has been paid, it is non-refundable.

What if the course is cancelled?

In the event that Silk Road Slippers is unable to run the course, you will be offered an alternative course, or your deposit and balance will be refunded in full. Please note that Silk Road Slippers cannot guarantee the appearance of any particular Star Writer or team member at any Masterclass, as this is subject to a variety of factors including illness, injury, and events beyond Silk Road Slippers' control.
